REYMAN E MAIL REPORT – 19 MARCH 2008

Hello from partly cloudy and warm Alberton, South Africa. We have just gone through several days of cold and rain, so the sun is a welcomed sight! This is Karen updating you on what is happening here in South Africa.

BACK IN SOUTH AFRICA

Paul and I arrived back in South Africa on Tuesday the 4th of March. We had a good visit with Laurie, our daughter in Athens, Georgia, on the way out of the USA. It takes a while to get over jet lag and get back into a routine.

TIGANE CHURCH

Paul went to Tigane on Tuesday, the 11th of March, to touch base with Patson, the minister, and to take fifty plastic chairs. Twenty-three were paid for by a donation from Farewell Avenue Christian Church in Fairbanks, Alaska. The chairs were a special Easter price so Paul went ahead and bought 50. If anyone would like to donate toward the rest of the chairs the Tigane Church would be very grateful. Seven dollars will pay for one chair and \$189 dollars would pay for the remaining twenty-seven chairs.

We are going to Tigane for their Easter services which begin on Saturday. Paul will be preaching on Sunday morning. Friday and Monday are public holidays here and so most churches have conferences over the weekend.

ELECTIONS IN ZIMBABWE

Zimbabwe's presidential and parliamentary elections will be on the 29th of March. This may be a pivotal turning point in Zimbabwe. Please pray for the people who are suffering with inflation now at over 100,000 per cent and scarcity of fuel and food.

Four new children are now living at KCV in the second Australian house. The house parents are Jabulani and Patience Ndiweni. Jabulani is in charge of the Community Orphan Care Program run by KCV.

Themba Ndlovu, about two years old, is the last born in a family of five children. He and his five-year-old brother, **Timothy**, were placed at KCV, while the other three were placed at other children's homes. His mother, who is mentally retarded, fell sick and was being looked after by a well-wisher who realized their plight. The mother was then taken to the hospital while Themba and Timothy were taken to the police. The police later referred them to KCV through the department of Social Welfare.

Themba has adapted very well to the KCV environment. He remains at home while Timothy goes to preschool and appears bright. Themba loves playing with the other children and is always cheerful.

Dominic Moyo, twelve years old, has no siblings. His mother died when he was one year and four months old. He stayed with his maternal grandmother. However, because of poverty and old age, his grandmother could no longer afford to fend for him. It was at this time that KCV learned of this boy's plight through a cousin who is employed as a maid. He was then referred to KCV through the department of Social Welfare. Dominic is in grade seven.

Tsitsidzaishe Makwasha was found abandoned in a bushy area of Mandava township in the town of Zvishavane. A report was made to the police. Investigations pertaining to the whereabouts of the child's mother were done and these were futile. Tsitsidzaishe was taken to Zvishavane District Hospital where she has been kept for a year. After realizing that she needed a family for her developmental needs, she was then placed at Khayelihle Children's Village by the Social Welfare Department on the 22nd of February 2008.

Tsitsidzaishe has adapted very well to the KCV environment. She is always cheerful and seems to be happy to be in a family.
