Paul and I arrived safely in the USA on the 8th of April. We stayed a week with Laurie in Athens, Georgia, getting over jet lag and visiting with her in between her classes and internship. Friday, April 17th we were in the air headed for Kansas City where we attended a Christ in Youth mission team leader training from noon Friday until noon Saturday. Saturday afternoon, the 18th, we flew to Tampa, Florida, where we stayed two weeks with Paul's cousins, Bruce and Carol Rodda. They treated us royally while we looked for a fifth wheel trailer and pickup. It is an amazing story how we found what we wanted.

On the Monday after we got to Florida we looked at a nearby huge RV (recreational vehicle) place called Lazydays. My cousin had recommended it and it was just two miles from where Bruce and Carol live. We saw a fifth wheel trailer we liked and before we could get a deposit on it someone else had taken it. (There were many salesmen showing the trailers, and then they went into their office to reserve the trailers on their computer if someone wanted it.) So we went other places looking and didn't find one, but found the brand we wanted- a Sunnybrook. Paul had decided on the kind of pickup that was needed to pull the trailer, a Chevy Silverado with a duramax diesel engine and a six speed Alison transmission.



On Tuesday the saleslady at Lazydays called and said a trade-in just came in that we might want to look at-a Sunnybrook fifth wheel with a Chevy Silverado pickup that had a duramax diesel engine with an Allison transmission. How about that! So we have exactly what we wanted and didn't have to travel all over looking for it! God is good! Lazydays offers a driver's course to learn to drive safely as the trailer is 30 feet long. They also have an employee do a walk through showing us how to safely use the stove, water heater, lights and other gadgets in the trailer and how to hook it up and take it off the pickup safely. Then we had to buy several items to be able to live in it. Now we are set to travel west as we speak to supporting churches and visit friends. It will be home until we know where we will live.

Our daughter, Laurie, graduated from the University of Georgia with her Master's degree in Social Work (MSW) on Saturday the 9th of April. We are pleased and excited that she was selected as the outstanding MSW full time student, Athen's campus. She did her internship this school year at the Carter Center in Atlanta, Georgia. The Carter Center has hired her as project officer for the Rule of Law Program in Harper, Liberia, Africa. She will be starting the first of July, but will make a short two-week orientation trip beginning Sunday May 17th. We will get to see her one more time on the west coast at the end of June.
