Since our last e-mail update in Georgia we have traveled across the USA speaking at supporting churches and visiting friends and family. While here in Crescent City we have been visiting our son, Lonnie, and his wife, Beth. Paul's father is now living in Brookings, Oregon, which is about 30 miles north of Crescent City, and it has been good to see him. Our plans are to find jobs in this area when we finish our speaking dates, so we have been checking on the job market here. Our next speaking dates will be in Alaska. We will be speaking in Fairbanks on the 12th of July, Wasilla on the 15th and Anchorage on the 19th of July. It is always enjoyable to return to Alaska where we lived from 1972 to 1981.

We continue to manage even under these difficult economic hardships. The children have never gone without meals and we praise God for caring for them and for providing people

A team of 11 people from New Zealand visited KCV. They stayed at KCV for 18 days. The team did a lot of work, which included repairing doors, electricity, blocked water pipes, painting, teaching the word of God to children, taking out our children to Victoria Falls which is one of the world's wonders and to Chipangali Wildlife Orphanage. This was a very exciting moment for the children. The team cleaned and set up our old Farmhouse to accommodate 11 people. There are 11 beds and bedding. The house is vacant for visitors who would like to come, stay and help KCV. Of course, the accommodation is not a one star standard but it is habitable.

There are 88 children living at the Village. Recently, we took in three new children, two boys and a girl from the same family. Unfortunately, we had to send back one of the children to his family because of his bad behavior that was making it difficult for other children to live well. His grandfather who had come from South Africa was approached and asked to care for his grandson. The children's health is generally good.

We have 105 children in our Community Orphan Care Programme (COCP). These are orphaned children living either in child-headed families or with their grandparents who are too old to be gainfully employed. Some of them live with caregivers who cannot afford to look after them. Khayelihle then provides these children with educational and medical assistance and some supplementary food.

Our orchard is doing well and it has been fenced. We have since planted 40 orange trees, 20 guava trees, 26 mango trees, 2 avocados and 14 paw-paws. The orchard will be dedicated on the 12th of July 2009. We are looking forward to this great day, as a team from United States of America will be joining us.

The agricultural activities are doing fairly well. One and a half acres of our garden has chomoullier, sweet potatoes, cabbages, rape and onions. We are milking five cows for the children's consumption. Our broiler chicken project is doing well; we currently have 100 chickens that will be slaughtered for the children very soon.

Khayelihle Church of Christ continues to do well benefiting the children, KCV staff and neighbours who worship the Lord from the Southern Cross Learning Center building.

Thank you all for everything you do for KCV. May the good Lord continue to bless you.
