Sithandazile, who is a good mathematician and once took math lessons under the UNICEF provision, Sithabile, Nothando, and Vanessa, who are all active members of Scripture Union at their school. Felix, Bamblela, and David are good soccer players who play for their school team. The children had an opportunity to interact with the business community as well as the Churches, where they excelled in quizzes, singing and dancing.

Our Community Orphan Care Programme has 105 children and of these, 49 are girls and 56 are boys. One of the boys at college is doing a course in Cutting and designing where he is

taught the skills of designing and sewing clothes or fabric.

Our garden has been running short of water from time to time because the nation as a whole has a problem of power cuts. As a result, there is a small portion of carrots, onions and cabbage. Our livestock has also increased. The number of cattle is 35 and we have 25 sheep.
